Driver License Class E and Identification Card Requirements

Effective: January 1, 2010

In Compliance With The Federal REAL ID Act of 2005 & F.S. § 322.08

Proof of Identity (Bring One) *Immigrant / Non-Immigrant must provide original documents*

U.S. Citizens (Born or Naturalized)

- Original or Certified U.S. Birth Certificate (w/appropriate seal or stamp from **government agency**) ***Hospital Birth Certificate are not accepted***
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad
- Valid United States Passport or Passport Card
- Certificate of Naturalization / Citizenship

Proof of Legal Name Change (Original or Certified)

- Marriage Certificate issued by government agency (**Church certificate not acceptable**)
- Divorce Decree (**only applies if maiden name was restored on decree**)
- Court Order

If your name is different from what appears on your birth certificate or passport, you must present a legal name change document showing the trail of documents that link your name to your chosen proof of identity

Proof of Social Security Number (Bring One)

- Social Security Card;
- W-2 form (not handwritten)
- SSA-1099; or (must display applicant's name and full social security number)
- Any 1099
- Pay check/stub (must display applicant's full social security number)

* **Immigrant / Non-Immigrant:** a letter of ineligibility from SSA indicating they are not eligible to obtain a SSN. The indicated reason on the ineligibility letter cannot be because they failed to present the necessary documents*

Proof of Residential Address (Two proofs of address from separate sources) (P.O. Box not acceptable)

- Deed, mortgage, or residential agreement;
- Utility bill;
- Mail from financial institutions
- FDLE registration form completed by local sheriff's department
- A letter from a homeless shelter, transitional service provider or a halfway house, verifying they receive mail for the customers. The letter must be accompanied by a Certification of Address form (**please see attached**);

Honorably Discharged Military Veteran

Bring a **DD214/DD215** or other acceptable docs for veteran's designation.

CERTIFICATION OF ADDRESS
(For Class E Driver License or Identification Cards Only)

Instructions for completion are on back of this document.

Sections 322.051 and 322.08, Florida Statutes, require that applicants provide proof of residential address documents to obtain a Florida Class E driver license or identification card. Two documents from the approved documents list on the back of this document are required. If the applicant cannot provide two approved Florida residential address documents in their name, this affidavit may be used along with the documents provided by the individual whose name is on the proof of Florida residential address documents.

Instructions

The applicant may use this affidavit along with the one (1) proof of Florida residential address documents provided by the individual whose name is on the documents to meet the Florida residential address requirements. The Certification of Address document must be complete, legible, and signed by the applicant and the individual who is certifying the customer resides at their address.

- Minors residing with their parents may provide two (2) documents that show their Florida residential address in the name of the parent/guardian who is signing the parental consent form or follow the process for persons with no proof of Florida residential address.
- Persons presenting one address requirement in their name may use the Certification of Address form with Section A completed self-certifying their residential address. The Certification of Address will serve as the 2nd proof of residential address document.
- Persons with no proof of residential address documents – A person who cannot provide two (2) documents that show their name and current residential address may provide a minimum of one (1) document in the name of the person they reside with along with document(s) demonstrating family relationship, OR a completed Certification of Address document.

Acceptable documents demonstrating family relationship may include, but are not limited to:

- Marriage certificate
 - Military dependent identification card
 - Birth certificate
 - Adoption record
- Customers applying for a Class E driver license or ID card, who are homeless and reside in an agency where housing services are provided (homeless shelter, probation home, etc.) may provide a letter from the housing agency with the residential address and statement that the customer resides at the location and a Certification of Address document with Section A completed self-certifying their residential address. The Certification of Address will serve as the 2nd proof of residential address document. **A Certification of Address may not be used by Commercial Learner's Permit (CLP) and Commercial Driver License (CDL) holders.**

Homeless Certification Letters may come from:

- Homeless Shelter or Public Assistance Agency
- Local School District Homeless Education Liaison
- Foster Parent/Department of Children and Families

Customers who are homeless and do not reside in an agency where housing services are provided (homeless shelter, probation home, etc.), may provide a Certification of Address document with Section A completed self-certifying their residential address as General Delivery.

Acceptable Residential Address Documents:

1. Deed, mortgage, monthly mortgage statement, mortgage payment booklet or residential rental/lease agreement.
2. Florida Voter Registration Card.
3. Florida Vehicle Registration or Title.
4. Florida Boat Registration or Title.
5. Certification of Address
6. A utility bill or hook up/work order.
7. Automobile Payment Booklet.
8. Selective Service card.
9. Medical or health card.
10. Medical bill.
11. Homeowner's insurance policy or bill.
12. Automobile insurance policy or bill.
13. Educational institution transcript forms.
14. Professional license issued by a government agency in the U.S.
15. W-2 form or 1099 form.
16. Form DS2019, Certificate of Eligibility for Exchange Visitor (J-1) status.
17. A letter from a homeless shelter, transitional service provider, or half-way house verifying that the customer resides at the shelter address.
18. Mail from financial institutions; including checking, savings, credit card statements or investment account statements.
19. Mail from Federal, State, County or City government agencies (including city and county agencies).
20. Personal mail that does not list the recipient as "occupant". Example: Magazines, journals, etc.
21. Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) Registration form completed by the local sheriff's department or Department of Corrections.
